# ADB Project Gender Categories

## 1. Gender Equity Theme (GEN)

- Gender equality and women's empowerment (GEWE) as explicit project outcome
- Directly supports GEWE
- e.g., Gender-focused education project, women SME project

## 2. Effective Gender Mainstreaming (EGM)

- GEWE substantially integrated but not explicit outcome
- Directly supports GEWE
- e.g., Infrastructure, PSM

## 3. Some Gender Elements (SGE)

- Indirectly supports GEWE
- Gender addressed in mitigation where applicable + some proactive gender actions/features

## 4. No Gender Elements (NGE)

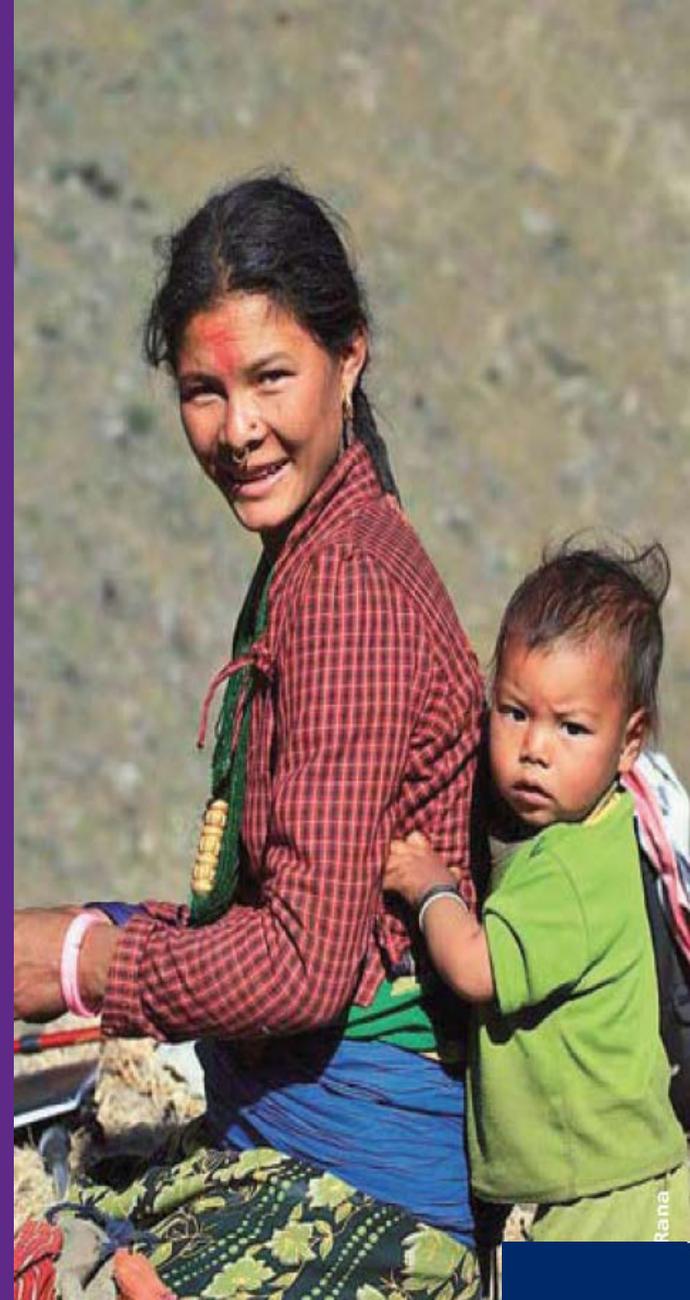
- Gender not integrated in design

# Project Gender Action Plans (GAPs)

## ADB's Gender Mainstreaming Tool

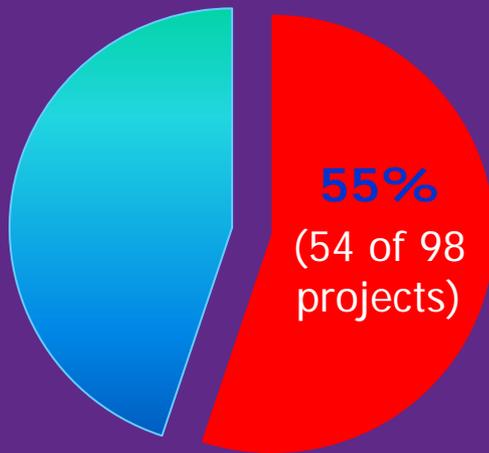
- Gender analysis in project preparation
- GAPs mirror project outputs
- Gender targets and design features
- Gender performance indicators in project logframe
- Inclusion of GAP in project documents
- Gender specialists in project implementation teams
- Legal covenant for GAP implementation



# Gender Mainstreaming in ADB-CIF Portfolio

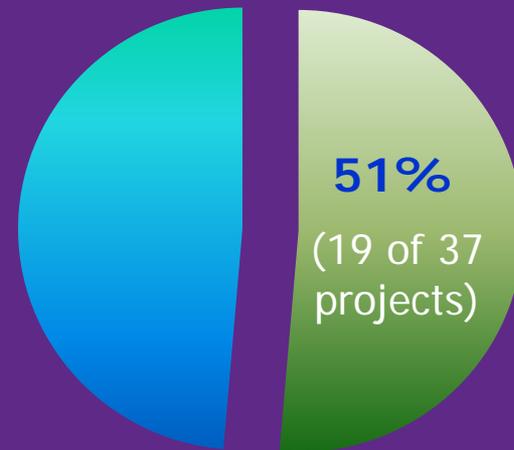

- Within GM in ADB-CIF projects, no GEN theme and only EGM

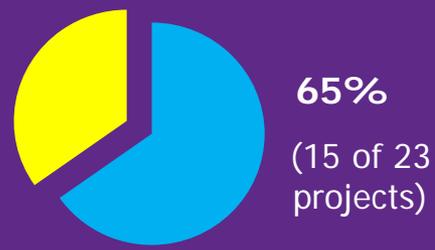
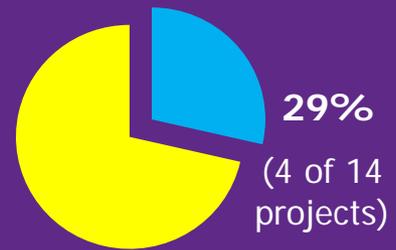

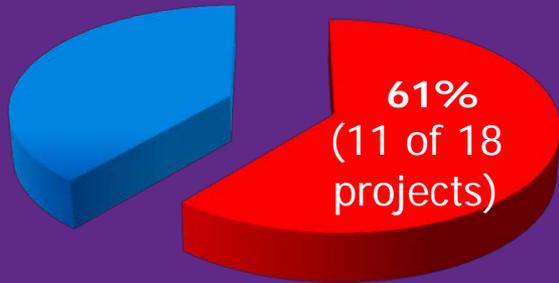

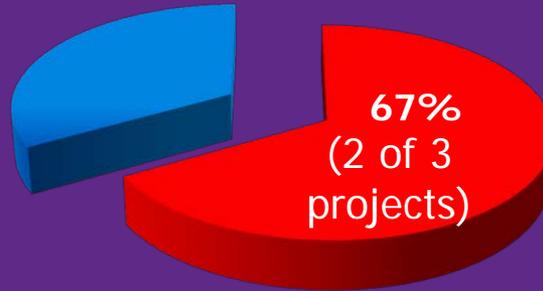

# Nepal: Climate Resilience of Watersheds in Mountain Eco-Regions (2013-PPCR-EGM)

- **Decision-making:** Women and disadvantaged groups in VDC (at least one each) and community watershed and land mgt groups (40% women and at least 1 in leadership)
- **Time poverty:** Improved water storage infra to reduce time for water collection (by 75%)
- **Training & skills:** Watershed management and conservation (60%);
- **Staffing & employment:** TVET for youth (F 33%); field staff (F20%); local women for survey assistants



# Vietnam: Sustainable Urban Transport for HCMC Mass Rapid Transit Line 2 (2012-CTF-EGM)

- Targets of 20% construction and 30% station jobs for women
- Dedicated waiting spaces for women on platforms
- Shop spaces for female-owned businesses
- Women-only carriages with additional child seating and storage space for prams/shopping
- Secure street lighting around and security cameras inside stations
- Ticketing systems and train schedules to suit multiple trips and intermodal transport usage
- Marketing to women as metro users
- Gender capacity development for project staff



# India: Rajasthan Renewable Energy Transmission Investment Program (2012-CTF-EGM)

- Rajasthan Renewable Energy Corporation to establish Community Development Fund to run a Solar Park
  - 25% women in management committee
- Solar Park to provide community support:
  - Livelihood for women: SHGs on book-keeping, accounting, finance management and negotiations skills; micro enterprises development (animal husbandry, embroidery and handicrafts) and market linkages;
  - Awareness of better health practices and sanitation
  - Water supply (200 HHs) and lighting (100 HHs)



# Some Observations

- Rigorous at-entry GM system in MDB crucial for good designs
- Quality of gender analysis challenge
- Value added of CIF in building women's resilience?
- CTF public sector GM approaches – why not in private sector?
