Climate Investment Funds (CIF) - Nature People and Climate Program (NPC)

Distrito Nacional, Dominican Republic November 14 - 16, 2023 Aide Memoire – Joint Mission

I. OBJECTIVES AND PARTICIPANTS

- 1.1 The first Joint Mission regarding the Nature People and Climate Program (NPC) of the Climate Investment Funds (CIF) for the Dominican Republic was carried out in hybrid format from November 14 16, 2023. The mission was coordinated by mutual agreement between the Government of the Dominican Republic (GoDR), represented by the National Council for Climate Change (CNCC) as the focal point of the NPC program and the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources (MNARN), and the CIF partner multilateral development banks (MDBs), namely, Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) as the coordinator of the Investment Plan (IP) design, along with the World Bank (WB), and the International Finance Corporation (IFC).

- 1.3 On behalf of the GoDR, participated Rodrigo Fincheira (Interinstitutional Relations Advisor of the CNCC) and from the MNARN, Otto Cordero (Head of the Deputy Ministry of Coastal and Marine Affairs), on behalf of the Deputy Ministry of Forestry Resources, Sol Teresa Paredes (Coordinator of PES program), Lemuel Familia (Technical Director) on behalf of the Deputy Ministry of Protected Areas and Grisel De Oleo on behalf of the Deputy Ministry of Soil and Water.
- 1.4 Other details of the institutions and experts that participated in the Mission can be found in Annex 1.
- 1.5 The main objectives of the Joint Mission were to:
 - i. Review IPPG study progress and suggestions for activities that each consultant team is proposing for the IP,
 - ii. Review and discuss the Dominican Republic's CIF-NPC IP's main components and proposed investments.
- 1.6 The specific activities of the Mission were designed to:
 - i. Socialize the main aspects of each preliminary component of the IP with GoDR and MDBs.
 - ii. Review the proposed projects and development of the overall IP framework and its key elements with the GoDR, MDBs or other relevant stakeholders, to identify any necessary adjustments to be incorporated, including prioritization within areas of focus.
 - iii. Engage and include feedback from relevant stakeholders from GoDR such as Ministry of Environment, MDBs and other important stakeholders.

II. ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT

- 2.1 The Mission held presentations by consulting teams, as well as discussions and meetings regarding proposed initiatives and projects involving various stakeholders, institutions, and implementers. This facilitated progress in defining the IP in accordance with the Mission's Terms of Reference (TdR).
- 2.2 The key issues discussed can be found in the detailed agenda can be found in Annex 2.

III. BACKGROUND

3.1 As part of the IP preparation process, from March 27th to 30th, the scoping mission was carried out in coordination with the CNCC, MDBs, and CIF. During this Mission, the general objective of the IP and the studies required for the design of the operation were defined: (i) Identification of the threats, exposure, and vulnerability of the watershed to climate change impacts; (ii) occupancy and status of agricultural activities inside the protected areas within the Yuna watershed; (iii) Potential use of Payment for Environmental Services (PES); (iv) potential for ecotourism activities in the watershed; and (v) potential for blue economy development in the lower areas of the watershed (v) Studies of Nature-based Solutions for the restoration of ecosystem services and (vi) Menu of agricultural technologies for the implementation of improvements and best practices in the sector.

IV. AGREEMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- 4.1 The general objective agreed for the IP is to "Leverage and complement sectoral investments (current and future) in the Yuna Watershed to ensure an integrated and sustainable management of the watershed to strengthen its resilience to the impacts of climate change and foster sustainable economic growth of the communities with Nature-based Solutions"
- 4.2 The specific objectives agreed upon for the IP are to "i) Strengthen the regulatory framework and institutional capacities for integrated watershed management and the implementation of Nature-based Solutions, ii) Restore and conserve key ecosystem services in the Yuna watershed through the implementation of Nature-based Solutions and iii) Promote economic diversification and the active participation of communities and other local stakeholders in the planning and execution of sustainable economic projects".
- 4.3 The IP will be carried out under the structure of 3 components derived from each specific objective, which are i) Institutional and Regulatory Capacity, ii) Ecosystem Restoration and Conservation, and iii) Economic Diversification.
- 4.4 The thematic areas identified as prioritized subcomponents, according to each component, are as follows for

Component 1:

- i. Development and updating of Management Plans and other strategic instruments: This activity will involve the review, update, and development of Management Plans and other strategic instruments addressing specific aspects of basin management. It will include identifying critical areas, defining conservation and restoration strategies, as well as integrating nature-based solutions into these plans.
- ii. Support for waste management in the Yuna watershed: This activity will focus on implementing programs and strategies to properly manage solid waste in prioritized municipalities within the watershed. It will include awareness campaigns, establishing waste collection systems, and appropriate waste disposal to promote reduction, reuse, and recycling, thus mitigating their environmental impact.

Component 2:

- i. Design and implementation of Nature-based Solutions in prioritized micro-watersheds: This activity will concentrate on identifying, planning, and executing nature-based solutions specific to selected micro-watersheds within the Yuna watershed. This may involve projects such as reforestation, mangrove restoration, erosion control, among others, aiming to enhance ecosystem services and strengthen the resilience of these areas.
- ii. Implementation of strategic Payment for Ecosystem Services initiatives: This activity involves developing and implementing programs for payment for environmental services or similar mechanisms to incentivize conservation and restoration practices among local communities. This could include financial compensations for those contributing to water resource protection, biodiversity conservation, or restoration of key ecosystems.

Component 3:

- i. Design and implementation of ecotourism products: This activity entails creating and promoting sustainable tourism products that highlight the natural richness of the watershed. It includes route planning, nature tourism activities, cultural promotion, and community involvement in providing tourism services.
- ii. Diversification of fishing activities in the lower area of the Yuna River and its mouth: Efforts will focus on diversifying fishing activities in these areas, promoting sustainable practices, responsible fishing techniques, and introducing complementary activities such as aquaculture to alleviate pressure on natural fishing resources.
- iii. Training + Awareness-raising: This cross-cutting activity will focus on training key stakeholders, including government officials, community leaders, and the general population, on the importance of conservation, implementation of nature-based solutions, and economic diversification. It will include workshops, training programs, and awareness campaigns to promote understanding and active participation in the sustainable management of the Yuna watershed.
- 4.5 Additionally, it was noted that activities related to the agricultural sector and the inclusion of good practices and financial facilities to ensure resilience and sustainability of the sector will be addressed through the complementary projects DR-L1161 (Yuna Watershed Management Plan Project) and DR-L1157 (Sustainable Investment Fianncing Program and Productivity Enhancement y the Agricultural Sector of the Dominican Republic), financed by the IDB in partnership with the GoDR.
- 4.6 The timeline and key milestones agreed during the mission, is detailed in chapter V.
